The shed is continually projects to be carried out at the shed. The men " get their teeth" into the available work that has been taken on by the shed. Below are some of the current projects .



A ramp was required by RSL Care. The trailer used to transport walking frames belonging to the passengers needed a ramp to assist in loading them into the trailer . Here Des is seen preparing the trailer for the ramp that has now been fitted.

The disc adjacent, about the size of a small plate, is indented with many grooves. It is used to assist stroke survivors, people with dementia and similar ailments to regain the sense of touch. By running fingers in the grooves, the person can re-train the sensitivity of their fingers back to almost normal. The



original product was reproduced in the shed by a vacuum moulding process and many were made available to the Chaplain at Sunnybank RSL for use with her therapy groups.



These extension cables have been elevated from the floor to above head height to avoid electrical accidents. Until we can have a complete electrical installation carried out

in the shed, this is one way to improved electrical safety, removing the extension leads from under our feet.

As well as the projects, we have our own maintenance program to carry out. The container we received recently had some leaky spots in the top, resulting in some material suffering water damage. A new metal roof has now been fitted, so the container can now be use to store equipment and materials without fear of water damage.

STAY STANDING —Over eight weeks from April to June our Shed sponsored a Brisbane City Council program called 'Stay Standing'. Developed by physiotherapist Monique King, the program is designed to empower seniors with practical and scientifically supported solutions to help us stay independent, healthy and safe. Sunnybank Uniting Church made their facilities available for the sessions.

Monique and several guest presenters led sessions on such things as fall prevention, continence, bone health, eyesight, chronic pain, medication management, care of our feet and Tai Chi (great for balance). We were taught simple exercises to improve our balance and over the two months all participants saw improvement in this area.

The feedback from those who attended was very positive. All had enjoyed the program and had learned much from it. And the morning teas and the party on the last day were also good. I recommend the

Ben Guha. Ben commenced wood turning in 2001 and started his wood crafting 4 years ago. He combines an artistic design with complex wood crafting and the illustrations



show the result of his latest creation. It involved carving Jacaranda the bowl from a block, creating the stained glass window effect with a dental type drill, then air brushing, pyro-graphing,

stippling, embellishing,

bleaching the outer edges, and coating the inner edges of the tiny windows with a reflecting paint. It took him about 80 hours of very careful working with special tools to achieve the result shown. He is a member of



Queensland Wood Turners Association and the World of Wood Turners (based in Canada). He does many demonstrations at wood turning events during the year, and he will visit our shed on the 30th August to show some of his techniques and creations to our members. He has fortunately been encouraged and inspired by his wife from the time he started his passion with timber.
