We know that a classification for each member will also be introduced, based on experience and skills. This will assist in maintaining the standards necessary for Health and Safety regulations.

The dream of a Community Garden is a step closer to realisation. The request for permission to place a shipping container near the shed ( to be used for gardening tool and equipment) has been sent to the Uniting Church Council and seems to have been approved. The area where the garden will be located has been nominated by the Church and our team of prospective gardeners are getting ready to do the preparation need to establish the above ground garden beds.
