• <u>SOME STATISTICS ON BOWEL CANCER</u> These are about men our age, and yet it is the one thing we don't wish to talk about. Bowel cancer is more common in men:

The risk of developing bowel cancer increases with age.

In 2010, the age-standardised incidence rate of bowel cancer was 73.7 cases per 100,000 men, compared with 51.1 cases per 100,000 women.

In 2009, the average age of bowel cancer diagnosis was 69.3 years. In 2010, the risk of developing bowel cancer before the age of 85 was <u>1 in 12</u>.
