At the committee meeting held on October, 17th., the following matters were discussed. The grant we were promised at the last Federal Election has finally worked it's way through the system and we now have \$15.000 to spend on tools and equipment for the shed. Unfortunately, the conditions attached to the grant were almost unable to be understood, let alone adhered to. Des has a big job on his hands to follow it up, clarify the guidelines and find a way to move the shed forward with a better selection of tools that this money makes possible. Let us hope he recovers from his time in hospital and is back with us soon.

Ian and Peter are going to find the space needed for our proposed new tools and equipment, and find a suitable way to set up our main shed to make room for them . Some of our existing saw benches and similar items might be available for purchases by the members when this happens.

It has been difficult to get names on rosters for the various activities we take part in—barbeques at Bunnings, Assembly work at Masters and Bunnings, Badge sales for Remembrance day and Anzac day, and finding a way to share the washing up after morning tea each shed day. A large white board will be set-up near our assembly area for morning tea so all members can see where the manpower is required. It was decided to cancel our badge selling at Sunnybank Hills Shopping town because of the poor position we were allocated there. Calamvale will be our one outlet this November. Taking part in this badge selling is one way we can reduce the amount we have on loan from the RSL. The purchase of a shed uniform is going ahead– Des is following up shirt styles, and a logo will be attached when we take delivery of them. Money for this was made available
