She wants to create mini-libraries for parents and children to access in the Acacia Ridge area where there is no public library.

Bendigo Bank and Bunnings are sponsoring her idea by supplying materials but she needs help in building some boxes.

The mini-libraries are made from marine ply and look like houses with a pitched roof and perspex windows.



They sit on a post and are about half a metre in size. Please see Warwick and Wyn if you are able to help out.

Rebecca would like to promote the project in a nearby park at the end of June by having people decorate a few of the assembled boxes.

first Aid Course

Following the Defribulator demonstration we had recently, the committee decided to pursue the funds to run a First Aid course involving Ben Pritchard's group.

We have been successful with a grant of

\$1,500.00 to conduct a First Aid Course for 10 members. It is usually \$150. However, the cost through APL Group (Ben) is \$100.00, so we can offer the course to 10 more. This gives us 20 places



all up. If we don't get enough takers we can offer the vacancies to the Community Garden group or to Church members.

It is essential that as many as possible of our shed members are familiar with CPR and other first aid techniques.

There is a list at the shed, see if you can find the time to join in — you may end up saving your mate's life!

PROJECT COMPLETE



The rehabilitation unit at QE2 hospital needed our assistance. People who are involved in car accidents or perhaps have had a stroke are often left with impaired hand/eye co-ordination skills. So Colin and Mukhtiar have been working on 3 activity boards to assist people who have these brain injury problems. The first board involved the manipulation of various locks and catches. The second had to do with turning a tap. The final one requires the user to plug and unplug a power cord, usb and other leads into sockets.

Hopefully these boards will help these patients in their recovery.
