Hopefully, this will be the start of hundreds of these .." libraries" as enquiries are coming in from all over Australia wanting to know more about this method of teaching little children to become interested in reading. 

### Wood rack.

It started as a temporary rack for the long timbers that were being donated to us after the shed became established.



Recently, we realized it needed more

than a tarpaulin to cover up the timber. It was decided that a cover be built

over the rack to keep the timber waterproof. . It has now been completed as a temporary roof and should last us as a storage area until funds are available to include timber storage in our plans for expansion.





Committee: We had 2 apologies for this meeting-Ken T and Des. We also had Thomas and Mukhtiar attending for the first time.. Mike presented his financial statement .Our funds are in good shape thanks to Mike. Duncan Pegg has found our insurance is adequate for our shed operation. Ken gave us an update on grant applications. Ken also gave us a welfare report, outlining a better way of keeping track on those among us who might need some assistance but who slip thru the cracks unnoticed. We received a letter from the mother of a 5y.o. down syndrome child who needs a small set of steps with a handrail to assist him to learn to walk. The discussion flowed between the desire to help someone in need and the possibility of being sued if someone gets hurt using gear that we had made. The committee decided to get more details about the device needed and where the liability ends (when you hand over the device to a trained O.T. who is going to use it to help the child). The last shed day for the year is Friday 18th Dec. and we recommence on Friday 8th January 2016.
