A team of researchers from UQ are developing a smartphone application that aims to monitor voice problems over the phone.

Dr Christina and her team will be visiting us at the shed on Friday 29 January.



They would like us to test some smart-phones running the application in order to ensure that the end product is easy to use and meaningful. We would be asked to chat with the robot for around 5 minutes. Following this our group would give our opinions to the team.
